Opening the concerts will be A Perfect Circle, led by Tool's Maynard James Kennan. Nine Inch Nail's "The Fragile" album entered Billboard Magazine's charts at No. 1. Other close-by concert sites will be Detroit, (April 14) and Columbus (April 15).

It's been 48 years since the late Alan Freed's original Moondog Coronation Ball took place at the old Cleveland Arena. The headliner at this year's Magic 105.7's Coronation Ball — the Four Tops — formed a year later, in 1953.

The Tops, inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1990, will top a WMJI/FM 105.7's six-group concert at 7:30 p.m. Friday, March 24, at the Gund Arena. Tickets, \$26.75 and \$49.75 for gold circle seats, are on sale at the Gund Arena box office, E. 6th St. and Huron Rd., Cleveland, and at Ticketmaster (216) 241-5555 Cleveland and (330) 945-9400 Akron.
