They said Goldmen knew about his "outside activities" (payola) and still Goldmen insisted that he sign.

The station merely wanted information and had no knowledge of the payments received.

They said "that when he signed with ABC Network Werbach was V.P. of Gen Council told him to lay heavy on Am-Pac records at his theatre shows"

Werbach denied this vigorously to the Committee -

Talent K before Upkeman was with the station - Fred started in June 1958 - strictly an employee - \$800 per wk or a fixed amount (scale) depending on the amount of time he was on the air - I could work on the outside if there was no conflict and the station used its first regional John Day talent show 1957 somewhat before - Upkeman heard Fred presenting the show - Upkeman got in touch with Fred and told him that if he is going to advertise he had to pay. As the time for the show approached Fred saw Upkeman and told him he wanted to advertise - agreed that a times scale K which amounted to 10% of the profit from the show & (Barracuda)

10% of the profits plus  
out of pocket costs for travel  
charges — by Statley Theta

Statley got \$1800 for the  
show —

Second show — Xmas. New  
Year 1958-59 — Fred wanted  
the same arrangement but  
agreed was 10% to the  
last project or \$1000 which  
ever was greater —

The period of advertising  
was expanded in Fred's favor.  
Separate K with Bonscale  
\$1000 obtained by WABC

During Jan 1959 — talent  
K terminated on or before 1959 —
