(Continued from page 1) hours of Rock and Roll. Virtually unknown, Allen Freed left Cleveland last year and hit the big city with his Rock and Roll Show. Needless to say, Mr. Freed came in like a roaring lion, and it looks like he is here to stay.

Often imitated but never duplicated, this syndicated disc jockey was born in Johnstown, Pa. on December 15, 1922. He is the proud father of a boy and two girls and Mrs. Freed is promising a blessed family addition in July.

Recently many white entertainers, visualizing the tremendous financial gains involved, have entered the Rhythm and Blues field and are reaping the profits. Thus we find a situation where, though Negro songsters have introduced the songs, white vocalists, often using identical arrangements, are making the money and being credited with the sudden popularity of these records. Currently, there are three songs of the Rhythm and Blues variety listed among the nation's coveted "top ten."

Realizing the injustice of this situation, Allen Freed has gone all-out to maintain a policy of playing the original platters made by the original entertainers. Mr. Freed tells me that this policy has met with overwhelming approval from his many listeners who are crying for more and more.
