

Alan Freed to Play Disks On Miami Station WQAM

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 28 (AP)—Alan Freed, the disk jockey once known as the "King of Rock 'n' Roll," will join WQAM radio station Saturday night.

Mr. Freed has left station KDAY in Los Angeles and will present a nightly recorded show on WQAM from 7 to 10 P. M., according to Jack Sandler, general manager of WQAM.

One of the nation's best-known disk jockeys, Mr. Freed was discharged by New York radio station WINS after a show in Boston touched off a riot in which several persons were injured.

He joined WABC, the American Broadcasting Company's New York radio outlet. He was discharged by WABC in November, 1959, when he refused to sign an affidavit swearing he had not taken payola—undercover payments to promote records.
