With District Attorney's Office since July 16th, 1962.

- (1) Present in office of A.D.A. Stone on morning of Saturday, October 20, 1962. Also present Gerald Harris, Criminal Law Investigator, Alan Freed, Michael Direnzo, Warren Troob and Mr. Stone.
- (2) Stone warned Freed of his rights and informed him that he had not sent for him. That Stone would listen to his side of the story and if he had any information which indicated that the station was really aware he was taking money such evidence would be carefully investigated.

Stone would ultimately decide whether evidence was such that the information against Freed was to be dismissed.

However, inasmuch as Freed was voluntarily submitting himself for questioning, he would have to answer all questions even if they would tend to incriminate him.

Any admissions which Freed might make would be used against him if Stone decided case had to be tried.

- (3) Freed indicated that all this had been explained to him by his attorneys Direnzo and Troob and that he was willing to do so. Freed was also informed that he could terminate the meeting anytime he desired.
- (4) AS TO HIS DEALINGS WITH JERRY HAINE OF COSNAT DISTRIBUTING CO.:

Alan Freed admitted that he received \$6,000.

Two checks numbered 2028 and 3231 were deposited in his account, each in the sum of \$2,000. Not his endorsement on checks, but they were deposited in his account.

The third check, 4558, he is not sure what has happened to that money. Wasn't his endorsement.

He stated that these monies were given to him as loans but the basis of making these loans was to "influence his judgment" in playing Cosnat Records on Radio Station WABC and on T.V. Station WNEW.
