Promotion manager of United Artists, 729 Seventh Avenue,
from Jan. 1958 - July.

Testified Fourth February 1960 Grand Jury on
under grant of immunity.

Friedlander has known Freed since approximately 1953.

Friedlander entered into an agreement with Jack Hooke
while A.F. was at WINS.

The agreement was to pay \$750 a month in cash to expose
U.A.'s records on the ALF. show. [A.F. would not accept
check].

Friedlander discussed the deal with his supervisors, then
brought the \$750 and records to Jack Hooke. Friedlander
got the cash from Sy Mayo of U.A.

Friedlander stated that once U.A. started to pay the
defendant, U.A.'s records started to appear on A.F.'s show.

U.A. would pay a fixed amount of money each month $\frac{1}{2}$ even
if there was no new record releases. If a record did not
move on defendant's show - U.A. would drop that record
and substitute a new one.

All payments were delivered to Jack Hooke at 1619 B'way -
never at the radio station - no \$ was ever given directly
to A.F., but Friedlander did discuss the records with him.

After first payment K. Luttman delivered the \$ for
Friedlander.

There was no new conversation when A.F. went from WINS to
WABC radio - the "deal just continued."
