3. Met A.F. in 1954 (463)
4. Halonka entered into an agreement with A.F. early in July 1959 in A.F.'s home (Coliseum Apt) (871) whereby Halonka was to pay A.F. \$500 a month for exposure of Halonka's records on A.F.'s radio program on station AOC (87V). The understanding was to increase exposure of Halonka's records & not merely to get exposure (admission by J. Halonka in affidavit in RA's notes.)
5. Frank suggested the trust to be joint (87V) and in addition suggested that checks be made payable to Olga Boling (878). However all checks were handed directly to A.F. & ^{were made} in A.F.'s (899-880. & admission to RA. by Halonka)
