

# To Start Thursday Evening

Beginning tomorrow night at 11:15, a series of weekly radio programs saluting Kent State university and featuring KSU students will be broadcast over radio station WAKR, Akron, on the Request Review show.

Alan Freed, musical director and disc jockey at WAKR, sent the following invitation to Stater Columnist W. Dan Oana:

"Dear Dan:

We in Akron, for the past few years, have realized that Kent State university is one of the fastest growing small universities in the country.

Having known you for several years—I knew I could count on your complete cooperation in helping me with this new enterprise.
